Hebrews (A Faith that Endures)

POINT: "What is the book about?"

It is about anchoring in that which is real & lasting so as to endure.

PURPOSE: "Why was the book written?"

To show faith in Christ superior to ceremonial ritualism

PRACTICAL APPLICATION: "How does this affect my life personally?
