WHAT IS FORGIVENESS?

Forgiveness in the Old Testament (*"Salach"*) always has God as the subject. That is to say that only God can truly forgive. The Psalmist cries out in Psalm 51:4, *"Against Thee, Thee only, I have sinned"*

Why? Because the term "<u>Salach</u>" refers not to an overlooking of an offense but rather to a payment rendered for the offense. Thus when used, it is repeatedly coupled with the term "<u>atonement</u>", ie., Lev 4:26,31,35; 5:10,13,16,18; Numbers 15:25,28 Hebrews 9:22b states *"without shedding of blood there is <u>no</u> forgiveness"* True forgiveness requires complete and total restitution which no man could ever pay or <u>make right</u> all his wrongs!

So what does it mean when Christ commands <u>us</u> to forgive? Matthew 6:14,15 *"Aphiemi"* - to send away Luke 6:37 *"Apoluo"* - to let loose ... release" Ephesians 4:32 *"Charizomai"* - to show unconditional favor Note: There is no command to <u>forget</u>, that is a divine act (cf. Is 43:25), yet we are to let go of our vindictive spirit and be gracious to others whether they deserve it or not!

Matthew 6:12-16 and Matthew 18:21-35 states that forgiveness is that which a believer does because of his overwhelming <u>gratitude</u> for God's patience compassion, mercy and release towards him. All wrongdoing done to the believer seem insignificant and meaningless in comparison.

The absence of <u>faith</u> and <u>gratitude</u> means the absence of the forgiving spirit God requires of man.

A further note:

Faith believes: 1) God is just (Romans 12:19)

2) God is an advocate to those who walk in His ways (Romans 8:28)
